





Business type of JIMTOF 2018 Visitors








Breakdown of JIMTOF 2018 overseas visitors







1-6 Any Charges, Fees and Commissions

Any and all fees and charges that may arise with respect to the payment of the fees related to the participation in the exhibition (such as remittance charge, foreign exchange commission and commission to make and remit payment in Japanese yen, correspondent bank charge and inward remittance charge) shall be borne by the exhibitor. If the full payment is not made, the exhibitor shall be required to pay to Organizers, in addition to the amount of insufficiency, an amount of not more than 10,000 yen to cover the extra expenses of the administrative procedures resulting therefrom.

2-2 Application to exhibit

(1) Please make your application online via JIMTOF2022 official website by using the "Exhibitor Application Form." No other method of application will be accepted.

If you are a first-time exhibitor at JIMTOF, please submit documents with a summary of your exhibit items and your company information via post or email. (See "Classified list of Exhibits" P. 13).

(2) In the case of multiple companies applying to exhibit using the same booth, one company shall conduct all the necessary procedures as a representative, including the application, payment of various fees, etc.

For exhibitors who are not the representative exhibitor:

- Those with their company's own employees, products, and services provided at the exhibit booth shall be considered "Co-exhibitors."
- Those without their company's own employees at the exhibit booth but with their own products and services, provided shall be considered "Represented Companies."
After approval of the exhibitor application, co-exhibitors and represented companies may register separately for a fee.

(3) When a trading company or distributor applies as an exhibitor on behalf of a manufacturer, please submit a written agreement or authorization letter from the manufacturer of the products via post or email, at the time of the application. The format does not need to be standardized. Furthermore, if applying on behalf of an exhibitor etc. that is an overseas manufacturer, the written agreement or authorization letter must be in Japanese or English.

(4) The person making the application must have authority within the applicant organization for signing a contract to exhibit at this fair.

(5) Should any of the information provided on or with the application change at a later date, please notify the JIMTOF Fair Management Office at Tokyo Big Sight Inc. as soon as possible and obtain its approval.



2-4 Application Acceptance and Booth Adjustment

After receipt of the application, Organizers will notify the applicant in writing as the official acknowledgement of participation in the exhibition by the end of January 2022. However, there might be cases that Organizers coordinate the number of the booths requested or cannot accommodate the application taking previous (JIMTOF2018) exhibit records of applicants into account when total demand exceeds the exhibition floor capacity or reviews of the application reveal irregularities. In these cases, Organizers will notify such applicants in writing by the end of January, 2022. In this regard, Organizers or the cooperating organizations shall not be liable for any damage caused by rejection of the application or reducing the number of booths.

2-5 Exhibition Agreement

The agreement shall be deemed concluded when Organizers send the official acknowledgement of participation in the exhibition to the applicant, upon which the applicant shall acquire the right to use the Exhibition Space as an exhibitor.

2-6 Payment Terms

Organizers will send the exhibitor the first invoice for the half amount of the booth rental fee, together with the official acknowledgement of participation in the exhibition by the end of January, 2022, which the exhibitor shall remit to the specified bank account by the due date stated on the invoice. Then, Organizers will send the exhibitor the second invoice for the balance of the booth rental fee by the end of April 2022, which the exhibitor shall remit to the specified bank account by the due date stated on the invoice. (Bank handling charges are the liability of the exhibitor.) In case the exhibitor is a member of cooperating organizations, the organization may handle billing and collection of the fees on behalf of Organizers. However, Organizers may invoice the whole amount of the booth rental fee at a time if it is necessary to do so.

2-7 Exhibition Space Allocation

Organizers will decide on the allocation of the exhibition space (please refer to Article 2 of "The Provisions of Exhibition Agreement for JIMTOF2022," P. 11) and will notify the exhibitor of the space allocation, with the second invoice for the balance of the booth rental fee. The exhibitor has no right to oppose or demand changes with respect to the allocated exhibition space. Also, the exhibitor is not allowed to conduct such actions on part or all of the allocated exhibition space as selling/buying, collateralizing, transferring or lending to any third party, except for co-exhibitors and represented companies. (Please refer to 2-2-(2) for "co-exhibitors and represented companies".)

2-8 Cancellation or Modification of Exhibition Agreement

The exhibitor may not cancel or modify the exhibition agreement, in principle, whether in whole or in part, except to the extent that the exhibitor notifies Organizers of such intention in writing or otherwise and obtains its consent thereon, in which event, however, the exhibitor shall be required to pay a penalty to Organizers in the amount set forth in the table below, with the day on which Organizers receives the notification in writing or otherwise from the exhibitor as reference.



If any amount of the booth rental fee is already paid, the whole or a part of such amount already paid shall be appropriated to the cancellation fee. Further, the amount of the cancellation fee to be paid when a part of the exhibition agreement is cancelled shall be calculated based upon the amount of the cancellation fee attributable to the size of the exhibition area to be cancelled. If the exhibitor loses the qualification as a member of the organization, it shall constitute a modification of the agreement, and the status of the exhibitor thereunder shall be changed to "non-member." In this case, Organizers shall additionally charge to the exhibitor the amount to cover the difference arising in the booth rental fee, and the exhibitor shall pay such amount to Organizers. If the exhibitor does not start using the allocated exhibition space by 1:00 p.m. on November 7, 2022, Organizers will take it as the cancellation of the agreement, and the exhibitor will lose the right to use the space. In this case, Organizers will not refund the paid-up amount to the exhibitor. Furthermore, Organizers or the cooperating organizations shall not be liable for any damage caused by such actions.

3. Display and Decoration

3-1 Decoration Height Requirements

All decorations including lighting must be confined to a maximum height of 3.0m (refer to the picture A below). However, the height limit for decorations rises up to 6.0m in the area which is 3.0m away from passage-ways, adjacent booths and walls (refer to the picture B below. Banners are the exceptions. Please see "3-4 Banners in Booths"). For reasons of fire safety, the construction of roofed or covered booths and decorations over 3.0m high are limited to the approval of Organizers. The exhibitor wishing to include any of these contradictions must apply and submit blueprints to Organizers to obtain permission. After consulting with the Fire Department, Organizers will study the drawings and advise the exhibitor as to the location of smoke detectors and the necessity to install package-type fire extinguishing equipment (the cost of installation will be the responsibility of the exhibitor). There is no height limit for the exhibits, however, please check with the application form and notify Organizers when the exhibit is over 3.0m.



Height Limit A : Lower than 3.0m
In the case of double-row booths, decorations higher than 3.0m are not permitted (as well as thin panels or signs).
 B : Lower than 6.0m

3-2 Eased restrictions on the height for installation of lighting equipment

Only when exhibitors, which occupy 15 or more booths, meet the following requirements, they shall be able to install lighting equipment measuring up to 6.0m in height, with no setback away from passage-ways and a 1.0m setback from the adjacent booths.

- (1) If lighting equipment measuring up to 3.0m in height cannot apply enough light in showing exhibits to visitors due to the characteristics of these exhibits (for example, when a large machine is displayed at the edge of a passage).
- (2) If it is considered that the lighting equipment measuring more than 3.0m, which should be placed in an exhibition stand set adjacent to a wall of the venue, does not affect the view of other companies' exhibition stands.
- (3) The exhibitor has submitted an installment plan document to Organizers in advance and has obtained permission.
- (4) The lighting equipment should meet the following requirements:
 - ① The lighting equipment should consist of lighting that applies light to exhibits and the support structure and should not have a decorative factor.
 - ② Their shapes should enable the lighting to be installed on the top of the support structure.
 - ③ The support structure must be necessary for the installation of the lighting.
 - ④ The lighting and its support structure should not have any factors suggestive of certain companies such as the name of exhibitors and logos.
 - ⑤ The color of appearance should be a simple color such as white, black, or silver, and should not extremely stand out.

3-3 2-Story Booth (Three or more stories are not permitted.)

At JIMTOF 2022 there will be no fees levied on 2nd floor space; however, a 2-story structure may only be erected by the exhibitor who has contracted for 15 booths or more at that location. Also, 2nd floor space may only be used for business meetings.

Full details of conditions applying to such structures will be made available in the "Exhibitors' Manual."

3-4 Banners in Booths

More than 21 booths of exhibit at one location may apply for banner. For security reasons, Organizers will make and put up all banners for the exhibitor at the exhibitor's expense.

3-5 Decoration Materials

All materials used for decorations must be approved as fire proofed by the Japanese Fire Service Act. The exhibitor wishing to use materials approved by overseas laws is required to submit a written notice as required along with a product sample to Japan Fire Retardant Association for quality assurance certification in order to prove that the materials meet the applicable standards.

3-6 Precaution

The regulations above may be changed as necessary in the future. For more details about displays and decorations, including regulations above, please refer to "Exhibitors' Manual".

4. Handling of Fire and Hazardous Materials

The exhibitor is not permitted to use open flame or to bring hazardous materials in the exhibition area by The Fire Prevention Ordinance in Tokyo, except for the case in which they obtain the written permission in advance from the local fire station under jurisdiction. The "open flame" means a device or an object that generates a flame or spark, or a device the heating unit of which is exposed to the outside. The "hazardous materials" indicates gunpowder, combustible gas, and other materials listed on the Fire Service Act, Appended Table 1. The exhibitor who wants to use these hazardous materials in the fair is requested to notify the effect in the application form. Also, the exhibitor can contact Organizers for the reference materials or more detailed information. Even in the case of the permission from the fire authorities, there might be a limit to the amount of hazardous materials that can be brought in, which is determined by the layout of the hazardous materials in the booths, and the surrounding conditions. Also, the exhibitor is not permitted to operate machines containing oil in excess of specified volume. If the exhibitor applies an amount of hazardous materials that exceeds the specified volume, Organizers will adjust the number. (Refer to the annexed table.)

5. General Information

5-1 Retail Sales

The on-site sale of exhibit items is strictly prohibited during the fair period. This instruction does not apply to any printed materials regarding the exhibited items."

5-2 Cancellation of the Fair

Organizers may be forced to cancel the fair itself on the grounds of Acts of God, a large-scale epidemic of an infectious disease, regulations or a request of the government, an administrative agency or a public institution or an organization similar to the foregoing, the land or building where the fair is to be held becoming unfit to hold it or any other force majeure or event not attributable to the responsibility of Organizers. Organizers, however, shall not be liable to the exhibitor for any damage caused by the cancellation. In this case, Organizers shall return to the exhibitor the booth rental fee already paid to Organizers by then after deducting therefrom the amount set forth in the table as the necessary expenses. If the exhibitor has not paid any amount of the booth rental fee by the time the cancellation of the fair is decided, it shall be obliged to pay to Organizers the applicable amount set forth in the table.

5-3 Change of the Fair Schedule and Opening Hours or the Site Scale

Organizers may be forced to change the fair schedule and its opening hours or the site scale on the grounds of Acts of God, a large-scale epidemic of an infectious disease, regulations or a request of the government, an administrative agency or a public institution or an organization similar to the foregoing, the land or building where the fair is to be held becoming unfit to hold it or any other force majeure or event not attributable to the responsibility of Organizers. The exhibitor cannot cancel or modify the application or the agreement based on such changes. Also, Organizers shall not be liable to the exhibitor for any damage or the added costs caused by the changes shown above.

5-4 Organizers' Care and Exemption from Liability

Organizers shall exercise their due care for the management, maintenance, protection and preservation of the entire exhibition hall and the exhibits. Organizers, however, shall bear no liability for any damage or pilferage loss of the exhibits and other displayed items due to causes which are not attributable to Organizers such as natural disasters or acts of God.

5-5 Compensation for Damages

The exhibitor shall take full responsibility for any damage to the facilities, building structures of the venue, or persons caused by the negligence of the exhibitor, its agents, or representatives.

5-6 Responsibility for Payment

The exhibitor will pay all booth rental fees and other expenses invoiced by Organizers and bear responsibility until all payment are completed.

5-7 Bonded Display Area

Organizers will apply for the designation of bonded display area so that the exhibits can be displayed as bonded items. The exhibitor who wants to display the exhibits as bonded items is requested to notify Organizers in advance by indicating to the effect in the application form.

5-8 Issuance of documents necessary for exhibitor Visas

Organizers will not issue documents necessary for exhibitors Visas such as an invitation guarantee letter.

5-9 Observance of Regulations

The exhibitor shall observe the regulations laid out in the "General Regulations", "The Provisions of Exhibition Agreement", "Exhibitors' Manual" and other regulations established by Organizers. Organizers reserve the right to cancel the application or the exhibition agreement if the exhibitor fails to observe the regulations. In this case, Organizers shall not be liable for any damage to the exhibitor caused by such actions.

5-10 Jurisdiction and Interpretation of Agreement

Any litigation between Organizers and the exhibitor arising from the "General Regulations", "The Provisions of Exhibition Agreement", "Exhibitors' Manual" and other regulations established by Organizers shall fall under the jurisdiction of the Tokyo District Court. In this case, all the regulations shall be interpreted on the basis of the Japanese language version of the agreement and in accordance with the laws of Japan.

Provisions of Exhibition Agreement for JIMTOF 2022

In conjunction with participation in JIMTOF 2022 (The 31st JAPAN INTERNATIONAL MACHINE TOOL FAIR) to be held from November 8 to 13, 2022 (hereinafter referred to as the "Fair"), the applicant wishing to participate in the Fair (hereinafter referred to as the "Applicant") and Tokyo Big Sight Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "TBSI") hereby agree to observe these "Provisions of Exhibition Agreement," "General Regulations" as well as "Exhibitors' Manual" and such other rules and regulations that TBSI establishes and provides to the Applicant (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Provisions of Exhibition Agreement, Etc.>").

Article 1. - Application for Exhibition and Agreement

The application for participation in the exhibition and execution of the agreement therefor shall take effect when the Applicant submits the prescribed application to TBSI and TBSI receives the same from the Applicant.

Article 2 – Size of Exhibition Area and Location of Exhibition Booth

The size of the exhibition area shall be coordinated by TBSI based on the number of booths applied for by the Applicant at the time of the prescribed application procedures and notified to the Applicant by TBSI with the official acknowledgement of participation in the exhibition, and the location(s) of the exhibition booth(s) shall be determined by TBSI through booth allocation. TBSI shall notify the Applicant of the location of the exhibition booth(s) after the booth allocation is determined. The Applicant shall have no right to object to, or request a change of, the location of the exhibition booth(s) once determined by TBSI (hereinafter the size of the exhibition area and the location of the exhibition booth(s) determined as above shall be referred to as the "Exhibition Space").

Article 3. - Conclusion of Agreement

TBSI shall notify the Applicant, if it is the case, that the application to participate in the exhibition has been accepted. The agreement shall be deemed concluded when TBSI sends the official acknowledgement of participation in the exhibition to the Applicant, upon which the Applicant shall acquire the right to use the Exhibition Space as an exhibitor.

Article 4. – Payment of Booth Rental Fee

- Based upon the size of the exhibition area stipulated in Article 2 hereof, TBSI shall invoice the booth rental fee set forth in "General Regulations" to be established by TBSI separately herefrom in two invoices, each in the amount of a half of the fee (first invoice and second invoice). The Applicant shall be obliged to pay the booth rental fee invoiced by TBSI by way of remitting the amounts to the bank account indicated on the invoices by the due dates designated in the respective invoices. However, TBSI may invoice the whole amount of the booth rental fee at a time if it is necessary to do so.
- If the Applicant is a member of the organization and the organization itself charges and accepts the booth rental fee to and from the Applicant, the payment to the relevant organization by the Applicant shall be deemed the payment of the booth rental fee to TBSI by the Applicant (the same shall apply with respect to the payment and receipt of the booth rental fee stipulated in these Provisions of Exhibition Agreement).

Article 5. – Bank Transfer Fee, Etc.

Any and all fees and charges that may arise with respect to the payment of the fees related to the participation in the exhibition (such as remittance charge, foreign exchange commission and commission to make and remit payment in Japanese yen, correspondent bank charge and inward remittance charge) shall be borne by the Applicant. If the full payment is not made, the Applicant shall be required to pay to TBSI, in addition to the amount of insufficiency, an amount of not more than JPY 10,000 to cover the extra expenses of the administrative procedures resulting therefrom.

Article 6 - Period of Use of Exhibition Space

The Exhibition Space may be used during the fair period, which is from November 8 to 13, 2022, and during the period from the first day of delivery to the completion of removal to be notified by TBSI to the Applicant separately herefrom; provided, however, that Applicant may lose its right to use the Exhibition Space even before the last day of removal to be notified by TBSI if TBSI considers that the Applicant has completed the work of restoration to the original conditions stipulated in Article 16 hereof.

Article 7 - Prohibition of Assignment of Exhibition Space

The Applicant may not pledge, hypothecate, assign or sublease all or any part of the Exhibition Space to any third party, whether for consideration or otherwise, nor may it swap it with the Exhibition Space of another exhibitor, except to the extent that it may cause a co-exhibitor or represented company who has submitted a prior written notification to and obtained the permission from TBSI in advance to use or sublease a part of the Exhibition Space.

Article 8 - Cancellation or Modification of Exhibition Agreement

- The Applicant may not cancel or modify the Exhibition Agreement, in principle, whether in whole or in part, except to the extent that the Applicant notifies TBSI of such intention in writing or otherwise and obtains its consent thereon, in which event, however, the Applicant shall be required to pay a penalty to TBSI in the amount set forth in the table below, with the day on which TBSI receives the notification in writing or otherwise from the Applicant as reference.

Deadline	Cancellation fee
After the due date of payment of the half amount of the booth rental fee (first invoice) but not after the due date of payment of the balance of the booth rental fee (second invoice)	50% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
After the due date of payment of the balance of the booth rental fee (second invoice)	100% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
After the due date of payment of the booth rental fee to be made in a lump	100% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)

If any amount of the booth rental fee is already paid, the whole or a part of such amount already paid shall be appropriated to the cancellation fee. Further, the amount of the cancellation fee to be paid when a part of the Exhibition Agreement is cancelled shall be calculated based upon the amount of the cancellation fee attributable to the size of the exhibition area to be cancelled.

- If the Applicant loses the qualification as a member of the organization, it shall constitute a modification of the agreement, and the status of the Applicant thereunder shall be changed to "non-member." In this case, TBSI shall additionally charge to the Applicant the amount to cover the difference arising in the booth rental fee, and the Applicant shall pay such amount to TBSI.
- If TBSI considers that any of the items set forth below has occurred to the Applicant, TBSI may cancel the Exhibition Agreement without any prior notice, in which case, TBSI shall not be required to return to the Applicant any amount of the booth rental fee already received, and TBSI shall not be held liable for any damage, etc. that may be suffered by the Applicant as a result thereof, and be entitled to demand the Applicant to compensate the damage, etc. suffered by it. If the Exhibition Agreement is cancelled during the period of the Fair, the Applicant must forthwith discontinue all actions relevant to the participation in the exhibition and restore the Exhibition Space to its original condition at the expense of the Applicant as stipulated in Article 16 of this Agreement pursuant to the instruction of TBSI:
 - If the Applicant is likely to defeat the purpose of holding the Fair;
 - If the Applicant is likely to disturb the public order or offend the good morals;
 - If the Applicant is likely to cause inconvenience to other exhibitors;
 - If the Applicant is likely to cause damage to the building of the venue, or to the facilities or instruments installed thereat;
 - If the Applicant is found to be an organized crime group, a member of an organized crime group, a person or organization affiliated with an organized crime group, a corporate extortionist or a group engaging in criminal activities under the pretext of conducting social campaigns or political activities, etc. (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Antisocial Forces");
 - If any false statement is made in the form of application to participate in the exhibition;
 - If any change is made to the contents of the exhibition but approval of TBSI is not obtained thereon;
 - If the Applicant breaches any of the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement, Etc. or fails to comply with TBSI's instructions;
 - If any of the foregoing items occurs to the co-exhibitor or represented company of the Applicant;
 - If the Applicant commits any act that is not appropriate at the Fair; or
 - If the Applicant is otherwise considered to cause a hindrance to the management and operation of the Fair.

Article 9 - Change of Schedule and Cancellation of Fair

- TBSI may change the dates, opening hours and size of the venue or cancel the Fair itself on the grounds of Acts of God, a large-scale epidemic of an infectious disease, regulations or a request of the government, an administrative agency or a public institution or an organization similar to the foregoing, the land or building where the Fair is to be held becoming unfit to hold it or any other force majeure or event not attributable to the responsibility of TBSI.
- TBSI shall not be held liable for any damage that the Applicant may suffer as a result of the circumstances provided for in the preceding paragraph.
- When the dates, opening hours or size of the venue is to be changed pursuant to the provision of Paragraph (1) above, TBSI shall be entitled to take necessary actions without securing consent of the Applicant, and the Applicant may not terminate or modify the Exhibition Agreement for the reason of the change that may be made.
- If the Fair is to be canceled pursuant to Paragraph (1) above, TBSI shall return to the Applicant the booth rental fee already paid to TBSI by then after deducting therefrom the amount set forth in the table below as the necessary expenses. If the Applicant has not paid any amount of the booth rental fee by the time the cancellation of the Fair is decided, it shall be obliged to pay to TBSI the applicable amount set forth in the table below:

Cancellation determined	Amount of necessary expenses to be deducted from the booth rental fee
By February 28, 2022	0% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
During the period from March 1 to May 31, 2022	10% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
During the period from June 1 to September 30, 2022	20% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
During the period from October 1 to 31, 2022	50% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)
On or after November 1, 2022	100% of the booth rental fee (total amount inclusive of the tax)

Article 10 – TBSI's Care and Exemption from Liability

- During the period of the Fair as well as the period for delivery and removal of the exhibits, TBSI must endeavor for a smooth operation of the Fair by exercising its due care of a good manager for the management and maintenance of the exhibits and the venue in general. TBSI shall be entitled to request the Applicant to suspend or restrict delivery and removal of the exhibits or performing demonstrations or otherwise effect other measures as may be necessary for a smooth operation of the Fair, in which event, the Applicant shall be required to immediately effect such measures as may be requested by TBSI at its own cost.
- If the Applicant fails to effect necessary measures as set forth in the preceding paragraph, TBSI shall be able to effect such necessary measures on behalf of the Applicant, and the cost and expenses needed for such measures shall be borne by the Applicant. TBSI shall not be responsible for any damage that may be suffered by the Applicant as a result thereof.
- TBSI shall not be held liable in any way even if any exhibit or decoration or other similar items of the Applicant is damaged or stolen if it resulted from Acts of God or event of force majeure or such other reasons not attributable to TBSI.

Article 11 - Applicant's Duty of Care

- The Applicant shall, on its own responsibility and at its cost, exercise its due care for the proper management of its exhibits, decoration and such other items during the period of the Fair as well as the period for delivery and removal and endeavor for a smooth operation of the Fair pursuant to the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement, Etc. during the course of delivery and removal and performance of demonstrations, etc.
- The Applicant shall be liable, personally, or jointly and severally with its agent, for any damage that may be caused to TBSI or a third party due to an intentional act or negligence of itself or of its agent.
- The provisions of the preceding two paragraphs shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to a co-exhibitor and represented company.
- The Applicant shall be liable, jointly and severally with the co-exhibitor or represented company, as the case may be, with respect to the liabilities of the co-exhibitor or represented company under Paragraphs (2) of this Article, which applies *mutatis mutandis* pursuant to the immediately preceding paragraph, or under the preceding paragraph.

Article 12 - Exhibits

- The Applicant may designate as its exhibits those articles that are shown in the "Outline" incorporated in "Guide to Exhibition" that TBSI establishes separately herefrom, and may exhibit only those articles that are approved by TBSI in advance.
- If the Applicant exhibits an article in violation of the preceding paragraph, and TBSI requires the Applicant to immediately remove such article, the Applicant must immediately do so at the Applicant's expense.
- If the Applicant fails to remove the article immediately as required under the preceding Paragraph, TBSI shall be entitled to take necessary measures on behalf of the Applicant, and the cost and expenses needed for such measures shall be borne by the Applicant. TBSI shall not be liable for any damage that may be caused to the Applicant as a result thereof.

Article 13 – Obligation to Pay Fees for Use of Facilities

- When the Applicant finds it necessary to use the facilities and/or services provided by TBSI (hereinafter referred to as the "Ancillary Facilities"), it must go through the formalities prescribed in the "Exhibitors' Manual" established by TBSI separately herefrom and pay the prescribed fees by the respective prescribed due dates.
- If the co-exhibitor or represented company deeds the Ancillary Facilities, the Applicant shall be responsible to go through any and all necessary formalities therefor and pay the fees that may be necessary in relation thereto.
- If the Applicant is a member of the organization, the provision of Article 4, Paragraph 2 shall apply *mutatis mutandis*.

Article 14 – Execution of Decorative Work

- Any decorative work must be executed by the Applicant on its own responsibility and at its own cost within the Exhibition Space.
- When executing decorative work, the Applicant shall be required to abide by the relevant provisions of the "Exhibitors' Manual" established by TBSI separately herefrom.
- If the Applicant executes any decorative work in violation of the preceding paragraph, TBSI may require it to immediately carry out such work as may be necessary to repair or rectify it at the Applicant's expense. In such a case, the Applicant must immediately repair or rectify the relevant decoration.
- If the Applicant fails to immediately repair or rectify the relevant decoration as required under the preceding paragraph, TBSI shall be entitled to repair or rectify it or take such other measures as TBSI may deem appropriate, and the cost and expenses therefor may be charged to the Applicant. TBSI shall not be liable for any damage that may be caused to the Applicant.

Article 15 - On-the-Spot Inspections

- When it is necessary for the reason of security, fire, or crime prevention, or otherwise necessary for the purpose of administration and operation of the venue, TBSI or its representative may, with proper prior notice to the Applicant, enter and inspect the Exhibition Space, and take any measures deemed appropriate by TBSI, in which event the Applicant shall be required to cooperate with TBSI in taking such appropriate measures.
- When an appropriate measure must be taken emergently, it shall be deemed sufficient if TBSI gives an ex post facto report thereof to the Applicant.

Article 16 - Restoration to Original Condition

- The Applicant shall return the Exhibition Space to TBSI after removing all exhibits, decoration and all other fixtures and equipment set up by the Applicant within the Exhibition Space at its own expense and restoring it to its original condition (hereinafter referred to as the "Restoration to Original Condition") by the expiration of the period of the right to use the Exhibition Space.
- If the Applicant fails to carry out the Restoration to Original Condition pursuant to the preceding paragraph, it shall be deemed that the Applicant has relinquished its rights of ownership to any and all exhibits, decoration and all other articles left in the Exhibition Space, and TBSI can dispose of any such articles at its discretion and may charge the cost and expenses therefor to the Applicant. The Applicant may neither make any claim nor raise an objection toward TBSI in connection therewith.
- In carrying out the Restoration to Original Condition of the Exhibition Space, the Applicant may not request TBSI to purchase any of its exhibits, decoration or other articles, demand payment of compensation for removal, or make any other claim whatsoever to TBSI.

Article 17 - Prohibited Acts

The Applicant may not commit to any of the following acts:

- To sell exhibits on the spot (excluding books and literature on the exhibits or the articles otherwise approved by TBSI);
- To display exhibits, execute decorative work, distribute catalogs or otherwise engage in advertising activities outside the Exhibition Space within the building and site of the venue, except to the extent otherwise approved by TBSI in advance;
- To engage in any act that may cause inconvenience to other exhibitors, visitors or TBSI;
- To engage in any act that may cause damage to the building, facilities or site of the venue, including the Exhibition Space;
- To engage in an act that is prohibited under the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement, Etc.; and
- To engage in any other acts or actions that TBSI considers inappropriate.

Article 18 - Observance of Regulations

The Applicant shall be required to observe the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement, Etc. TBSI may, under compelling circumstances, modify any of these regulations. The Applicant hereby agrees to such modification in advance and shall be required to observe the regulations so modified pursuant thereto.

Article 19 - Handling of Personal Information

- When the Applicant obtains any personal information at the Fair, it must comply with the Act on the Protection of Personal Information and other applicable laws and regulations, and acquire, manage, and administer such information in an appropriate manner.
- When using the personal information, the purpose of the use must be announced and notified in advance, and the relevant information must be used within the scope of purpose so announced or notified.
- Any dispute that may be given rise to with a third party in relation to acquisition, management or administration of the personal information shall be solved at the responsibility of the Applicant.

Article 20 - Jurisdiction

Both parties hereto agree that the Tokyo District Court shall have jurisdiction for the first instance over any litigations that may arise between the parties in relation to the Exhibition Agreement. In the event of such proceedings, any and all provisions shall be interpreted on the basis of the Japanese language version and in accordance with the laws of Japan.

Article 21 - Status of the Hosting and Supporting Organizations

Any acts that the hosting or supporting organization commits toward the Applicant with respect to the payment and receipt of the booth rental fee provided for in the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement (Article 4, Paragraph 2) or other matters that TBSI entrusts with the organization in relation to holding of the Fair shall be deemed as the acts of TBSI, and the acts that the Application commits toward the organization in relation thereto shall be deemed as acts committed toward TBSI.

Other Matters

Article 22. The Applicant cannot request TBSI to issue invitation guarantee letters or such other documents that may be necessary for the Applicant in order to have its visas issued.

Article 23. – Any matters not provided for in the Provisions of Exhibition Agreement shall be handled in accordance with the provisions of the rules and regulations established by TBSI separately herefrom. Other matters not provided for herein or therein and any matters concerning which ambiguities are found shall be treated as determined by TBSI and notified to the Applicant.
